



#### University of Northern Iowa

#### Rural Food Waste Reduction

- Each student generates **0.4 pounds** of food waste during lunch
- Each student generates 74 pounds of food waste per school year
- 2012-2013 school year over **39 million pounds** of food waste from private and public K-12 schools ended up in landfills across lowa

    - Expand IWRC's existing food waste webpages to include educational materials




