

- Food waste prevention and reduction project in rural lowa communities
 - October 1, 2016 September 30, 2017
- Community-wide assistance
 - 1. Food waste audits and waste sorts for ICI sector
 - Final report sent to each ICI participant
 - 2. Residential outreach
 - Residents received a toolkit with a scale to track food waste in home

Highlights of the Project


- U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Food: Too Good to Waste
 - Implemented in Lamoni and included 20 residents
 - Residents track food waste at home, then implement strategies to prevent and reduce food waste, and can continue to track food waste at home
- Davis County Community School District
 - Partnering with the City of Bloomfield to compost all the district's food waste
 - IWRC continues to provide regulatory and technical assistance for this project



Outcomes



 - 5. Solid waste and inventory management

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN

5 STEPS OF CERTIFICATION:

- 1. Perform audit of brewery
- 2. Score brewery's environmental efforts on checklist
- 3. Provide direct assistance to brewery to maximize score
- 4. Certify brewery
- 5. Promote certification level of brewery


